

SNOWMOBILE TRAIL PERMIT INFO SHEET

Thank you for taking the first step to a great sledding season by visiting an authorized trail permit outlet and purchasing a trail permit. For only \$200 before Dec 1st and \$250 after Dec 1st you have a passport to 4000 km of safe, groomed snowmobile trails provided by the 23 volunteer rural community snowmobile clubs of District One Snowmobile Association. All trails lead to many local destinations with trail side amenities, so **GO LOCAL IN DISTRICT ONE THIS SEASON!** Altogether, Ontario's OFSC clubs provide 36,000 km of safe, groomed snowmobile trails and are awaiting you this white winter for only \$200 before Dec 1st.

Always important every year is to take the time to fully complete your application with extra attention to the following points:

- 1) **It is the law to have a valid trail permit and registration.** By purchasing a trail permit, these dollars are used by club volunteers in order to provide great, safe, well signed and groomed trails.
- 2) **The permit should be displayed on the lower, middle of the windshield.** This location makes spot checks easier for the volunteer Trail Patrol, Groomer Operators, Trail Workers and OPP to inspect for compliance of the user pay system.
- 3) Fill out the permit application form completely:
 - **Check off and sign** for OFSC BENEFITS such as receiving the official OFSC magazine.
 - **Include your EMAIL ADDRESS** in order to receive club newsletters, up to the minute email blasts about trail improvements or trail changes and upcoming club events all electronically. **Lets all be a little greener.**
 - **Check off** the VOLUNTEER BOX even if it is only to volunteer for a few hours a season. A friendly club representative will contact you to provide more information and will make arrangements for training if need be to become an active volunteer to keep your club open for snow business.

CLASSIC TRAIL PERMIT INFO SHEET

- **Sled is to be 1997 or older** with a permit cost of only \$125.00
- **Registration/ownership is required and must be confirmed before purchasing a classic permit** go to www.district1ofsc.ca to download the permit application, requirements and for the locations where they may be purchased.
- **Fax the application** to 1-866-278-3140 **or mail it** to District One Snowmobile Association, P.O. Box 1432, Morrisburg, ON K0C 1X0
- We encourage classic permit buyers to buy early in order to prevent delays in getting out and enjoying the open trails.
